Washington and Lee is composed of two undergraduate divisions, the College and the Williams School of Commerce, Economics, and Politics; and a graduate School of Law. Students are encouraged to pursue **undergraduate research** and can apply for funding to support research on and off campus. W&L's four-week, one-class **Spring Term** immerses students in hands-on, in-depth and innovative experiences either on campus or across the globe.

Merit Scholarships

W&L offers a number of scholarships for which incoming first-year students may be eligible. W&L's premier merit scholarship is the Johnson Scholarship, a four-year award covering at least tuition, room and board and \$7,000 in funding for summer experiences.

The W&L Promise

The W&L Promise guarantees a minimum grant of tuition to any undergraduate student admitted to W&L with a total family income below \$125,000 and assets typical for their income. Students may also be eligible for additional grants to cover room, board and other educational expenses.
